L-39 Unusual Attitudes

Kissimmee, Florida-based Stallion 51, better known for its P-51 Mustang training, has expanded its syllabus to include an introduction to Unusual Attitude Training (UAT) utilising the Aero L-39 Albatros.

The course is described as an 'educational and exhilarating flying experience' and incorporates base-line upset manoeuvres including aerobatics.

The programme uses a highly modified L-39 equipped with state-of-the-art avionics, allowing Stallion 51 instructors to provide participants with an introduction to the basic principles and techniques of unusual attitude prevention and recovery. The aircraft is fitted with an on-board camera system that records all audio and video to allow the flight to be reviewed with the instructors and shared with others.
