

Today, The "Berlin Express" Makes Another Historic Flight

The "Berlin Express" P-51B achieved legendary status when American Bill Overstreet flew it under the Eiffel Tower during an epic World War II dogfight.

More than 70 years later, the "Berlin Express" is making history again. Stallion 51's Lee Lauderback is currently flying the "Berlin Express" from Texas to Duxford, England, following the same route the aircraft took as part of the military troop buildup in the UK during WWII. The four-day, 5,470-mile journey began June 28 and is being tracked in real time, which you can follow along online.

Once in Duxford, the owner of the "Berlin Express," Dan Friedkin, will pilot the historic aircraft in the Flying Legends Airshow, as well as with the Air Combat Command's F-22 aerial demonstration team at the Royal International Air Tattoo in Fairford, England.
